

Plan your afternoon and choose from among the five stops on this year's 16th annual tour. Garden Railways Tour sites are located in Wrightsville, Lancaster, Lititz and Manheim.


Tickets are just \$10.00 per person for ages 6 and over. Children ages 5 and under are admitted free of charge. Tickets are on sale on Eventbrite and in the Whistle Stop Shop museum store and will not be sold at the individual tour sites. A roster of Garden Railways Tour homes will be emailed/given to you following your ticket purchase. It is recommended that you plan the sites you want to visit in advance.

Garden railways are among the fastest growing interest area in model railroading, and many people find that trains add excitement to their gardens.

This creative, family-friendly hobby may be set up in very small spaces or large expanses, as well as in differing climates and in widely varying degrees of complexity. Garden railways have attracted the formation of enthusiast associations, special equipment from model train companies, websites and even its own magazine.

The Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania is home to a world-class collection of about 100 historic locomotives and railroad cars, a working restoration shop, an immersive education center, a vast research library and archives, special events and exhibits and a Museum store.

Next Stop, the Tamaqua Railroad Station! Take a step into the past as you enter Tamaqua's restored 1874 Philadelphia & Reading Railroad. Saved from the brink of demolition, the Tamaqua Railroad Station now serves as a heritage center, as well as a cultural and economic hub in Historic Tamaqua. Be sure to make a stop at the Tamaqua Railroad Station on your next visit!

There is plenty of parking in the lot on Route 309 South. After parking, cross the tracks safely at the pedestrian crosswalk. A handicap accessible entrance is located at the rear of the Station.

Click DOWNLOAD button on website to save "Save Our Station" song and to hear an original jingle written by Tamaqua's Bill Hughes to aid the restoration efforts.

RRB Issues Statements of Service

Each year, the U.S. Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) prepares a Form BA-6, Certificate of Service Months and Compensation, for every railroad employee with creditable railroad compensation in the previous calendar year. The RRB will mail the forms to employees during the first half of June. Anyone with compensation reported in 2022 who has not received Form BA-6 by July 1, or who needs a replacement, should contact an RRB field office by calling toll-free at 1-877-772-5772. A statement can also be requested online by clicking the "Request Documents" button RRB.gov/myRRB, or by using the tollfree number's automated menu at the end of the recorded greeting to request a statement of service months and compensation.

Form BA-6 provides employees with a record of their railroad retirement ser-

vice and compensation. The information shown is used to determine whether an employee qualifies for benefits and the amount of those benefits; therefore, it is important that employees review their Form BA-6 to see whether their own records of service months and creditable compensation agree with the form.

When reviewing the 2022 compensation total, employees should be aware that only annual earnings up to \$147,000 are creditable for railroad retirement purposes in that year, and that \$147,000 is the maximum amount shown on the form. In addition, the form shows service credited on a month-by-month basis for 2021, 2020, and 2019, when the maximum creditable compensation was \$142,800, \$137,700, and \$132,900, respectively. The BA-6 also lists the employer(s) reporting the employee's 2022 service and compensation.


